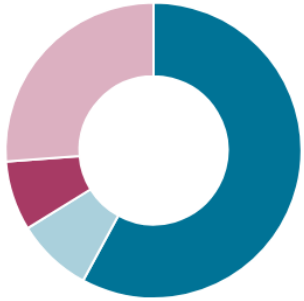

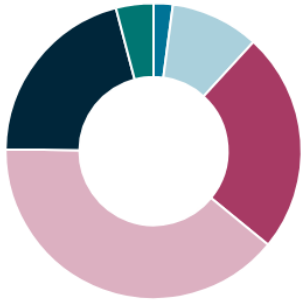

- Recruit personnel and oversee their training.
