
Census Population Counts Versus Demographic Estimates

2021 Census


- According to the 2021 Census, as of May 2021, New Brunswick's population was 775,610, up from 747,101 in May 2016 (+3.8%).
- It's important to note that certain individuals may be missed by the Census, while others may be counted more than once. The combined result of these two factors is referred to as "net undercoverage". In general, the Census typically underestimates the true population counts.
- Under-coverage is most common among individuals who:
 - Are young adults, especially men
 - Live in the territories
 - o Live in First Nation communities
 - Are single or separated
 - Have a mother tongue other than English or French
- Studies of coverage for the 2021 Census are currently on-going, with estimates set to be released in 2023. Over the past six Censuses (1991 to 2016), New Brunswick's population has been underestimated by 0.52% to 3.25%.

Annual Demographic Estimates

- Since the percentage of the population that the Census manages to capture varies over time and from region to region, Census population counts may not always be the most accurate estimates available.
- In addition to the Census, Statistics Canada releases quarterly and annual demographic estimates. These estimates are based on data from a combination of sources, including: the Census, birth and death records, tax filer data and immigration records. Currently, these estimates use the 2016 Census as their base.
- According to Statistic Canada's Annual Demographic Estimates, as of July 2021, New Brunswick's population was 789,225, up from 763,350 in 2016 (+3.4%).
- Once Statistics Canada has final estimates of coverage for the 2021 Census, this new Census data will be used to re-calibrate and revise its quarterly and annual demographic estimates. This is expected to occur in September 2023.
