Sector Definition

For the purpose of this profile, the Retail and Wholesale Trade sector includes the following sectors:

Retail Trade: This sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The retailing process is the final step in the distribution of merchandise; retailers are therefore organized to sell merchandise in small quantities to the general public. This sector comprises two main types of retailers, that is, store and non-store retailers.

Wholesale Trade: This sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The wholesaling process is generally an intermediate step in the distribution of merchandise; many wholesalers are therefore organized to sell merchandise in large quantities to retailers, and business and institutional clients. Wholesalers normally operate from warehouses or offices that are characterized by having little or no display of merchandise and neither the design nor the location is intended to attract walk-in traffic.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sectors 41 and 44-45.

Current Business Environment

GDP* and **Productivity**

In 2019:

- The Retail and Wholesale Trade sector represented 9.4% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$3.0 billion (chained 2012 dollars)^{1, 2}
- NB Labour Productivity^{2, 3} (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
 - This sector \$35.65 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
 - Average of all sectors \$48.47 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)



Employment in New Brunswick

In 2019:

- 52,100 were employed in the NB Retail and Wholesale Trade sector (72.7% full-time, 27.3% part-time)⁴
- 2,800 were unemployed⁴
- 14.4% of all employed in NB worked in this sector⁴
- 4.8% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.1% of all employees in the Province⁵




NB Unemployment Rate: 2019⁴ Retail And Wholesale Trade Sector vs All Sectors






Employment: 2010-2019⁶ NB Retail and Wholesale Trade Sector


Demographics

In 2019:


- 54,900 people were part of the labour force in the NB Retail and Wholesale Trade sector, of which 52,100 were employed⁴
 From 2010 to 2019:
- The percentage of females employed in the sector decreased from 50.8% to 46.8%⁴
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:4
 - Ages 15-24 decreased 1.6 percentage points
 - Ages 25-54 decreased 9.4 percentage points
 - Ages 55 and over increased 11.1 percentage points

Major Occupations

In 2019:

- 55.8% of those working in the NB Retail and Wholesale Trade sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right⁸
- These 31,600 employees represented 8.9% of all employed in NB⁸



Wage and Salary Information

In 2019:

 The average wage in the NB Retail and Wholesale Trade sector (\$17.49) was less than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$23.49)⁹

From 2010 to 2019:

 The relative change in the sector's average wage (+20.5%) was less than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+23.2%)⁹




Employment by Economic Region: 2010-2019¹¹

(Relative to 2018)




