## **Sector Definition**

The Other Services sector comprises establishments, not classified to any other sector, primarily engaged in repairing, or performing general or routine maintenance, on motor vehicles, machinery, equipment and other products to ensure that they work efficiently; providing personal care services, funeral services, laundry services and other services to individuals, such as pet care services and photo finishing services; organizing and promoting religious activities; supporting various causes through grant-making, advocating (promoting) various social and political causes, and promoting and defending the interests of their members. Private households are also included.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sector 81.


## **Current Business Environment**

### **GDP\*** and **Productivity**

In 2019:


- The Other Services sector represented 1.9% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$0.6 billion (chained 2012 dollars)<sup>1,2</sup>
- NB Labour Productivity<sup>2, 3</sup> (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
  - This sector \$20.17 output per hour of work *(chained 2012 dollars)*
  - Average of all sectors \$48.47 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)


#### **Employment in New Brunswick**


In 2019:

- 14,000 were employed in the NB Other Services sector (78.6% full-time, 21.4% part-time)<sup>4</sup>
- 600 were unemployed<sup>4</sup>
- 3.9% of all employed in NB worked in this sector<sup>4</sup>
- 9.2% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.1% of all employees in the Province<sup>5</sup>




#### NB Unemployment Rate: 2019<sup>4</sup> Other Services Sector vs All Sectors

## **Human Resources Profile**

#### **Demographics**


In 2019:

• 14,600 people were part of the labour force in the NB Other Services sector, of which 14,000 were employed<sup>4</sup>

From 2010 to 2019:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector increased from 49.1% to 51.4%<sup>4</sup>
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:<sup>4</sup>
  - Ages 15-24 decreased 3.4 percentage points
  - Ages 25-54 increased 2.9 percentage points
  - Ages 55 and over increased 0.4 percentage points

### **Major Occupations**

In 2019:

- 40.9% of those working in the NB Other Services sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right<sup>8</sup>
- These 6,400 employees represented 1.8% of all employed in NB<sup>8</sup>



### Wage and Salary Information

In 2019:


 The average wage in the NB Other Services sector (\$19.93) was less than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$23.49)<sup>9</sup>

From 2010 to 2019:

 The relative change in the sector's average wage (+20.8%) was less than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+23.2%)<sup>9</sup>





Employment by Economic Region: 2010-2019<sup>11</sup> NB Other Services Sector




### **GDP Forecast**






Forecasted Job Openings<sup>8</sup> NB Other Services Sector
