The Accommodation and Food Services sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in providing short-term lodging and complementary services to travellers, vacationers and others, in facilities such as hotels, motor hotels, resorts, motels, casino hotels, bed and breakfast accommodations, housekeeping cottages and cabins, recreational vehicle parks and campgrounds, hunting and fishing camps, and various types of recreational and adventure camps. This sector also consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in preparing meals, snacks and beverages, to customer orders, for immediate consumption on and off the premises.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sector 72.

GDP* and **Productivity**


In 2018:

- The Accommodation and Food Services sector represented 2.2% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$0.6 billion (chained 2012 dollars)^{1, 2}
- NB Labour Productivity^{2, 3} (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
 - This sector \$15.70 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
 - Average of all sectors \$47.57 output per hour of work *(chained 2012 dollars)*


Employment in New Brunswick

In 2018:


- 23,300 were employed in the NB Accommodation and Food Services sector (66.7% full-time, 33.3% part-time)⁴
- 1,800 were unemployed⁴
- 6.6% of all employed in NB worked in this sector⁴
- 4.6% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.8% of all employees in the Province⁵




NB Unemployment Rate: 2018⁴ Accommodation and Food Services Sector vs All Sectors

Demographics


In 2018:

 25,200 people were part of the labour force in the NB Accommodation and Food Services sector, of which 23,300 were employed⁴


From 2009 to 2018:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector decreased from 64.2% to 60.9%⁴
- The percentage of workers in this sector:⁴
 - Ages 15-24 decreased 5.3 percentage points
 - Ages 25-54 decreased 0.8 percentage points
 - Ages 55 and over increased 6.2 percentage points

Major Occupations

In 2018:

- 68.4% of those working in the NB Accommodation and Food Services sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right⁸
- These 16,500 employees represented 4.7% of all employed in $\ensuremath{\mathsf{NB}^8}$



Wage and Salary Information

In 2018:

 The average wage in the NB Accommodation and Food Services sector (\$14.04) was less than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$22.89)⁹

From 2009 to 2018:


 The relative change in the sector's average wage (+29.3%) was greater than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+22.4%)⁹





Employment by Economic Region: 2009-2018¹¹ NB Accommodation and Food Services Sector













Employment Forecast
