Sector Definition

The Public Administration sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in activities of a governmental nature, that is, the enactment and interpretation of laws and their pursuant regulations, and the administration of programs based on them. Legislative activities, taxation, national defence, public order and safety, immigration services, foreign affairs and international assistance, and the administration of government programs are activities that are purely governmental in nature. Government owned establishments engaged in activities that are not governmental in nature are classified to the same industry as privately owned establishments engaged in similar activities.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sector 91.

Current Business Environment

GDP* and **Productivity**


In 2018:

- The Public Administration sector represented 11.4% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$3.4 billion (chained 2012 dollars)^{1, 2}
- NB Labour Productivity^{2, 3} (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
 - This sector \$57.57 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
 - Average of all sectors \$47.57 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)

Employment in New Brunswick

In 2018:

- 24,500 were employed in the NB Public Administration sector (97.6% full-time, 2.4% part-time)⁴
- 900 were unemployed⁴
- 6.9% of all employed in NB worked in this sector⁴
- 62.9% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.8% of all employees in the Province⁵

Public Administration Sector vs All Sectors






Employment: 2009-2018⁶ NB Public Administration Sector

Human Resources Profile

Demographics


In 2018:

 25,500 people were part of the labour force in the NB Public Administration sector, of which 24,500 were employed⁴

From 2009 to 2018:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector increased from 47.9% to 49.0%⁴
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:4
 - Ages 15-24 decreased 0.7 percentage points
 - Ages 25-54 decreased 1.8 percentage points
 - Ages 55 and over increased 2.5 percentage points

Major Occupations

In 2018:

- 24.6% of those working in the NB Public Administration sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right⁸
- These 5,900 employees represented 1.6% of all employed in NB⁸



Wage and Salary Information


In 2018:

 The average wage in the NB Public Administration sector (\$31.02) was greater than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$22.89)⁹


From 2009 to 2018:

 The relative change in the sector's average wage (+19.7%) was less than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+22.4%)⁹





(Relative to 2018)




Employment Forecast
