### **Sector Definition**

The Construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in constructing, repairing and renovating buildings and engineering works, and in subdividing and developing land. These establishments may operate on their own account or under contract to other establishments or property owners. They may produce either complete or partial projects, including renovations or repairs to existing structures.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sector 23.

# **Current Business Environment**

### **GDP\*** and **Productivity**

#### In 2018:

- The Construction sector represented 6.9% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$2.1 billion (chained 2012 dollars)<sup>1,2</sup>
- NB Labour Productivity<sup>2,3</sup> (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
  - This sector \$42.42 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
  - Average of all sectors \$47.57 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)

### Proportion of GDP in NB: 2018<sup>1</sup> **Construction Sector**







### **Employment in New Brunswick**

#### In 2018:

- 23,300 were employed in the NB Construction sector (97.0% fulltime, 3.0% part-time)<sup>4</sup>
- 4,900 were unemployed<sup>4</sup>
- 6.6% of all employed in NB worked in this sector<sup>4</sup>
- 25.0% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.8% of all employees in the Province<sup>5</sup>




NB Unemployment Rate: 2018<sup>4</sup> Construction Sector vs All Sectors






# Employment: 2009-2018<sup>6</sup> NB Construction Sector

## **Human Resources Profile**

### **Demographics**

#### In 2018:

 28,200 people were part of the labour force in the NB Construction sector, of which 23,300 were employed<sup>4</sup>

#### From 2009 to 2018:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector increased from 7.8% to 8.2%<sup>4</sup>
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:4
  - Ages 15-24 decreased 2.0 percentage points
  - Ages 25-54 decreased 3.1 percentage points
  - Ages 55 and over increased 5.2 percentage points




NB Employment by Sex: 2018<sup>4</sup> Construction Sector vs All Sectors

### **Major Occupations**

In 2018:

- 39.1% of those working in the NB Construction sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right<sup>8</sup>
- These 9,600 employees represented 2.7% of all employed in NB<sup>8</sup>



### **Wage and Salary Information**


In 2018:

 The average wage in the NB Construction sector (\$23.81) was greater than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$22.89)<sup>9</sup>


From 2009 to 2018:

 The relative change in the sector's average wage (+25.1%) was greater than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+22.4%)<sup>9</sup>





(Relative to 2018)







