Sector Definition

The Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in activities in which human capital is the major input. These establishments make available the knowledge and skills of their employees, often on an assignment basis. The main components of this sector are legal services; accounting, tax preparation, bookkeeping and payroll services; architectural, engineering and related services; specialized design services; computer systems design and related services; management, scientific and technical consulting services; scientific research and development services; and advertising, public relations, and related services. In most of these industries, equipment and materials are not of major importance. Establishments primarily engaged in providing instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects and those primarily engaged in providing health care by diagnosis and treatment are not included in this sector.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sector 54.

GDP* and **Productivity**

In 2018:


- The Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector represented 3.3% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$1.0 billion (chained 2012 dollars)^{1,2}
- NB Labour Productivity^{2, 3} (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
 - This sector \$38.02 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
 - Average of all sectors \$47.57 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)

Employment in New Brunswick

In 2018:

- 16,100 were employed in the NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector (88.2% full-time, 11.8% part-time)⁴
- 500 were unemployed⁴
- 4.6% of all employed in NB worked in this sector⁴
- 2.6% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.8% of all employees in the Province⁵




NB Unemployment Rate: 2018⁴
Professional, Scientific and Technical Services Sector vs All Sectors






Employment: 2009-2018⁶ NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services Sector

Demographics

In 2018:


• 16,600 people were part of the labour force in the NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector, of which 16,100 were employed⁴

From 2009 to 2018:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector decreased from 45.5% to 36.0%4
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:⁴
 - Ages 15-24 decreased 0.8 percentage points
 - Ages 25-54 decreased 8.5 percentage points
 - Ages 55 and over increased 9.3 percentage points

Major Occupations

In 2018:

- 24.9% of those working in the NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right⁸
- These 3,900 employees represented 1.1% of all employed in NB⁸

In 2018:


 The average wage in the NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services sector (\$28.44) was greater than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$22.89)⁹

From 2009 to 2018:


• The relative change in the sector's average wage (+22.7%) was greater than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+22.4%)⁹




Employment by Economic Region: 2009-2018¹¹


Forecasted Change in Real GDP⁸ NB Professional, Scientific and Technical Services Sector (Relative to 2018)
